Reviewer 1:

As there is a lot of interest in reusable learning objects, we are very much interested in the do's and don'ts experienced here. Some questions that might come up among the audience concern the 'not invented here syndrome', technical compatibility between different learning environments and cross-institute accreditation of the material.

Reviewer 2:

This proposal deals with an issue, which is at the forefront of developments in technology-enabled learning - the creation and adaptation of learning materials. Their base in medical education has given the authors sound experience that should be of interest to a very wide audience.

The paper is clear and well presented and includes good references.

Reviewer 3:
